ACT ONE

4 INT. CAR - DAY

4

SFX: Car idling. Doors opening. Siding into backseat.

TOMMY

Rashid?

RASHID

Yessir. Tommy?

TOMMY

Yeah, yeah, let's move.

SFX: Doors shutting. Seatbelts.

RASHID

No problem. No problem at all. Are we all in? Good. I got water and mints in the side pockets if you like...

ETHAN

This is Rashid Abboud. He came to the states about a year ago, and like many immigrants, he's fallen into the gig economy...

RASHID

Nice masks by the way.

JAMES

Just drive man.

ETHAN

This is his first fare of the day.

SFX: Car driving.

ETHAN (CONT'D)

His passengers, Tommy and James, are carrying around 80 thousand dollars from Topeka National Trust, as well as a pair of sub machine guns.

RASHID

So what kinda music do guys like?

JAMES

You think they saw us?

TOMMY

Naw, be cool man. Be cool.

ETHAN

No this isn't Uber or Lyft. Rashid is a henchman for hire.

(then)

Yesterday he helped off-load stolen cargo, today he's a get a away driver. All of this through the App LAKY, that aims to disrupt the minion industry.

RASHID

Me. I love (music to come).

SFX: (music to come) floods the cabin. Police Sirens.

TOMMY

(yelling)

Oh shit, they're behind us.

SFX: Car revs.

JAMES

I thought you took care of the alarm!

TOMMY

That was your job!

JAMES

I am not going back to prison. Strap up!

SFX: Guns are cocked. Windows roll down.

RASHID

If anyone needs ear plugs I have some in the console.

JAMES

Fuck you pigs!

SFX: Machine gun fire. Cars flipping. Bullet ricochet.

ТОММУ

Floor it Rashid!

SFX: Stunt driving.

ETHAN

LAKY is one of many apps to hit the freelance henchman market this year, competing with others such as HENCH or STOOGE.

(then)

Once a unionized job, henchmen find themselves competing with men like Rashid, for gigs that traditionally came from a henchman hiring hall.

(then)

Villains and Criminals are using apps more and more as they drive the price of labor down.

SFX: Machine gun fire. Ricochet on Rashid's Car.

JAMES

Oh shit! I'm hit! I'm hit!

RASHID

I should warn you there's a two hundred and fifty dollar cleaning fee for bleeding in the cabin.

TOMMY

Get us fuck out of here!

RASHID

OK.

SFX: Accelerating.

TOMMY

Oh my god. Slow down. Slow down!

RASHID

I know a short cut.

TOMMY

Slow down!

RASHID

It's fine.

SFX: More cars crashing. Car squealing. Tommy and James screaming. Skidding stop.

RASHID (CONT'D)

See. Short cut.

TOMMY

Why are we stopped?

RASHID

Uh, you selected LAKY pool option. We're picking up another customer.

JAMES

Get me the fuck out of here man.

SFX: Slamming doors. Running.

RASHID

Don't forget to give me five stars!

ETHAN

They will in fact rate him four stars. This will drop him in the rankings, costing him over five hundred dollars in income this week alone. It will take him a month to return to his previous ranking, and he is still seeking the two hundred and fifty dollars for cleaning his car.

(then)

STEPHEN SINGH

Live from SPR News in Washington I'm Stephen Singh .

(then)

The Heroic Legion has announced that it is planning to open a second headquarters, "Tower Two," as a sister location to Tower One in Philadelphia.

(then)

The project is projected to cost upwards of two billion dollars and will house up to a thousand members in training.

(then)

Legion Leader Iron Barracuda made this statement:

SFX: Press conference walla. Cameras snapping.

IRON BARRACUDA

The Legion has been a guiding light for the heroes of the world for over seventy years. Tower Two will expand that light and our mission to "Do Good" across the world.

(then)

We are excited to bring our new class of heroes to the next great American city.

STEPHEN SINGH

The Legion has made an open call for proposals from any urban center within range of an international airport. This is expected to instigate a bidding war among candidate cities.

(then)

When asked about the arrest of Legion member Cosmos, Iron Barracuda said quote: "members come from a variety of backgrounds and political beliefs, but the Legion itself does not take sides."

UNDERWRITER

7 INT. TAS STUDIO - DAY

In the studio.

ETHAN

Welcome back it's These American Supers, I'm Ethan Schwartz.

(then)

Henching is an American tradition, accounting for 1.2% of the overall workforce, even showing up on the Career Aptitude Placement Exam in high-school.

(then)

They have the world's twelfth largest labor union, the International Henchman Group On Rights, or IHGOR for short. And even their own retirement community in Florida.

(then)

But like many legacy jobs in America, it too has been changed by the gig economy.

(then)

Ellen Spiegel has the story...

SFX: Music.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (O.S.)

The first thing stated in the terms and conditions of HENCH is that the company cannot be held responsible for bodily, financial, or situational harm undertaken while working as a contractor for HENCH.

(then)

This may include, but is not limited to; arrest by the police, kung fu, eye beams, super strength, concussive blasts, mutations, lacerations, incinerations, and snakes.

(adding)

Signing that agreement and providing a valid driver's license are all you need to become verified.

SFX: Hold on music.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (O.S.) (CONT'D)

It took about a week before I was given my first gig.

SFX: HENCH Ding.

FADE TO:

SFX: Highway overpass...

ELLEN SPIEGEL (O.S.) (CONT'D)

The app directed me to an abandoned handbag factory downtown. It was in the sort of neighborhood you usually try to avoid.

(then)

A great place to hide out.

8 INT. FACTORY - DAY

8

SFX: Water dripping.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Hello?

SFX: Voice echoing.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

I'm here for Croc Command?

SFX: Door shutting.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (O.S.) (CONT'D)

The shutter door comes crashing down behind me and then a bright light shines in my face.

TIM

Ellen?

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Yes?

SFX: Light turning off.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

The spotlights turns off and the overheads come on. I am greeted by a group of men dressed as anthropomorphic crocodiles. Think Olympic ski suit made from old lady handbags.

(MORE)

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

The leader introduced himself, but in the interest of protecting his identity, we'll just call him Tim.

MIT

You had coffee today? We have a Keurig in the back, just make sure you replace the water or Gold Croc will drown you in the sink.

(adding)

He's a good guy though.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

I expected ex military, former gang members, bikers. You know. Hard men. But everyone here is pretty friendly. Tim himself is a middle school teacher, and only does this part time to help pay off his mortgage.

MIT

Flexible hours, competitive pay, implants that let you breathe underwater. It's better than retail. Hey, let's get you a suit.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Tim takes me over to a rack of suits identical to his own.

(then)

When we find one that fits, I can't help but notice bullet sized holes, that riddle the front.

TIM

Don't you worry about that.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Let's take a second to talk about my employer...

SFX: News clip walla. We can hear "terrorist". Possible music.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

Croc Command has officially been designated as a religious group within the United States, while abroad it's widely considered to be a terrorist organization.

(MORE)

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

It's founder, Crocodile Commander created the group after the collapse of a Pyramid scheme in 1982.

SFX: Register sound.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)
Borrowing fascist iconography and a
cell based command structure, the
group has proven diffigult for both

cell based command structure, the group has proven difficult for both superhero and government agencies to combat. Today there are a least two members of Congress suspected of owing allegiance to the Crocodile Lord.

TIM

Most of us don't buy into the message. It's really just a job at the end of the day.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Again this is Tim.

TIM

Every once in awhile you meet the fanatics, and you just need to smile and nod while they gush on and on about their Crocodile God and how benevolent he is.

(distracted)

Oh here's your last piece of gear.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Tim hands me a gun.

SFX: Gun rattle.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

Is this thing loaded?

MIT

You should treat every gun as if it's loaded.

(adding)

But yes, this one is loaded.

SFX: Men bellowing. (See Crocodile bellowing)

TIM (CONT'D)

Hup, the boss is here.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

The men around us start bellowing and stomping their feet as they converge on another croc man with gold scales instead of our muted green.

GOLD CROC

Minions!

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Everyone falls into line.

GOLD CROC

Our fearless leader sends his thanks for our efforts to convert. To convert...

SFX: Paper rattling.

GOLD CROC (CONT'D)

Bisbee, Arizona!

CROCS

Cold blooded! Cold blooded! Cold blooded! Cold blooded!

GOLD CROC

We will bend these milk drinkers into willing servants of the Croc Commander!

CROCS

Cold blooded! Cold blooded! Cold blooded! Cold blooded!

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Fists pumping, we march into a series of white vans and head onto the highway...

SFX: Heavy van. Rain.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

So what are we doing today?

ΤТМ

General menace. The powers that be want us to "take over" areas, but really it's a glorified field trip.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

And the guns?

MIT

It's a part of the costume. Look chances of running into any resistance is slim to none. Our job is to look tough, say the words and then go home.

(then)

Everything will be great.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

The rest of the ride is spent in silence. If these men were like Tim, and were here to pay their rent or student loans I couldn't help but think about the circumstances that eventually brought them here.

SFX: Van stopping.

TTM

It's time.

SFX: Guns being cocked.

TIM (CONT'D)

Follow my lead.

SFX: Door burst open. Guns clinking. Screams.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

The sunlight is painful after an hour in the windowless van. We find ourselves in a parking lot behind a large stage.

(then)

Two overweight security guards in yellow t-shirts are caught unprepared for this rush of croc commandos.

TIM

Let me see your hands!

ELLEN SPIEGEL

We had infiltrated our way into the Bisbee Blues Festival. Inside, we stumble onto a group of stagehands sneaking a beer.

TIM

Tie them up.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Tim hands me zip ties and I fumble my way through tying the men to a the truss that made up the stage.

(then)

Thankfully they don't resist.

SFX: Zip.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

I'm so sorry.

STAGE HAND

It's OK, we're still getting paid.

GOLD CROC

When they call for the next act, we spring out on stage with the bomb. You three stay here and guard the van.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

I am on guard duty, while Tim is part of the away team.

TIM

(whispered)

And remember: menacing!

ANNOUNCER, HENCH, E1

And for our next act!

SFX: Drumroll.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

The crocs behind the curtain bounce with anticipation.

ANNOUNCER, HENCH, E1

The Bisbee Blues Festival is proud to announce...

SFX: Screams. Microphone feedback.

GOLD CROC

Bisbee! Croc Command has come to save you!

ELLEN SPIEGEL

They wheel the bomb onto the stage. But then things go south pretty quickly.

GILA MONSTER

Your cold blooded scheme ends here!

GOLD CROC

Gila Monster!

GILA MONSTER

That's right!

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Gila Monster is Bisbee's home town Superhero, and as it turns out, an avid music lover.

SFX: Gunfire.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

He is also immune to bullets. He jumps on the stage and cut through my fellow henchman without breaking a sweat.

SFX: Punching. Gunfire. Crashing.

CROCMAN

They got the leader let's cheese it!

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Tim? Tim!

SFX: Car doors slamming. Tires squeal.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

I hopped out of the van and looked for Tim. The other henchmen weren't so loyal. As Gila Monster jumped through the curtain, they sped off, leaving me behind.

GILA MONSTER

Stop right there!

ELLEN SPIEGEL

I fished in my bag for my press credentials. But Gila Monster passed me by, chasing after the van on foot. He caught it, but I didn't see what happened after he tore the doors off, because I am already running.

SFX: Metal tearing. Van escape.

SFX: Running.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

I ran six miles. Back to my hotel room.

(then)

Dressed, as an anthropomorphic, Crocodile.

SFX: Road walla.

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

I don't know if you've ever taken off a full body suit after running a marathon, but it truly does feel like shedding your own skin.

Back in the studio ...

ETHAN

Ellen, welcome back to the studio.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

It's good to be back Ethan.

ETHAN

So, did you get paid?

ELLEN SPIEGEL

An even one twenty for the day, but I was given a rating of three stars which pretty much is the last nail in the coffin of my henchwoman career.

ETHAN

How would you describe the overall experience?

ELLEN SPIEGEL

It was kind of a rush.

(then)

You're geared up, surrounded by strangers all working towards the same thing. And it's something new every day. I get the appeal.

(then)

When I was in college I bused tables, but had this been around, I dunno.

ETHAN

And what ever happened to Tim?

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Tim was caught by Gila Monster, and turned over to the police. We've talked on the phone a few times. He's hopeful, but he doesn't have money to post bond so he's sitting in the Bisbee County Jail waiting for sentencing.

(then)

It should be noted that HENCH and similar apps such as LAKY do not provide money for bail or legal services. Something they make sure not to advertise to potential employees.

ETHAN

That was Ellen Spiegel, investigative reporter for SPR Arizona. A special thanks to Rashid Abboud for allowing us to record his day on the job.

(then)
