STAN

I'm always thinking about milk, it builds strong bodies.

WHIZ KID

Thought that was what you did for Re-animator.

STAN

Ha! That was one time. It would've worked too if we had more wattage.

WHIZ KID

I'm shocked.

STAN

He wasn't, that's the problem.

PRODUCER BOT

Alert. End Banter.

STAN

Alright, Producer Bot's right. You've got tech questions? Ask the One and a half people with all the answers.

WHIZ KID

And we've got a caller. This is Sirene from Sandusky, Ohio. Caller, what's your major malfunction?

SIRENE

Hi!

SFX: Automatic Gunfire.

SIRENE (CONT'D)

Big fan of the--

SFX: Gunfire on Metal.

SIRENE (CONT'D)

--Show. Hoping you can settle a bet I have with my sidekick.

(More gunfire)

You know Armorium?

STAN

Sure, Dutch company. Made that car that couldn't be crushed.

WHIZ KID

That got recalled when all those people died from whiplash.

SIRENE

Well they make custom capes that they *claim* are bulletproof from any angle.

WHIZ KID

You want to test their hypothesis through observation?

SIRENE

Don't think I've got a choice.

SFX: Gunfire.

SIRENE (CONT'D)

I think we can wrap ourselves up and roll out there? Like a justice burrito.

(MORE)

SIRENE (CONT'D)

My sidekick is saying it's suicide. But bulletproof is bulletproof, right?

STAN

Well for me, it comes down to two questions. What's the model?

WHIZ KID

It'll say in the hem.

SIRENE

Let me... Yeah it's the X-370.

Stan and Whiz Kid both Hmmmm.

WHIZ KID

You see that's a complication. In 2017 Armonium got bought out by a conglomerate and they moved manufacturing to China and changed their process a bit. Instead of being pure adamantium, they use an adamantium/kevlar blend. So it's not quite as solid as it used to be.

STAN

(MORE)

STEPHEN SINGH (CONT'D)
Critics have noted that the Legion
has been seeking tax incentives and
grants that may cost the chosen
city upwards of six billion
dollars. Dr. Hanna Nasir of the
Future People said this when asked
about the project in an unrelated
interview:

DR. NASIR

I'm sure this expansion is useful for the Legion, but there is nothing in this proposal that will benefit the civilian population at large. (then)

There is an unspoken rule, that if you can see the body, make sure to poke it with a stick.

(then)

Thoughout history, there are dozens of accounts of heroes treating death as a minor setback.

(then)

They're resurrected. They're cloned. They're replaced by interdimensional counter parts. And their return isn't alway a happy one.

(then)

Ellen Spiegel has the story...

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Captain Phasmic gave his life to save the world, and yet you've probably never heard his name. There was no parade, no medal, no statue in his honor. All that stands in memorial to his sacrifice is single line in the Peoria Register's online weekly shout out section.

(then)

"Braino was defeated moments before destroying the world. Also dead: Captain Phasmic."

(a beat)
(MORE)

ELLEN SPIEGEL (CONT'D)

A single sentence between mentions of the upcoming spelling bee and the winner of the 25th pie eating contest.

LILY

You saw that one huh?

ELLEN SPIEGEL

This is Lily Cheslock, editor in Chief of the Peoria Register in Illinois.

LILY

Yeah we had written up a longer story but there just wasn't much of a demand.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Braino is a reliable feature on headlines throughout the region. He's made the FBI's most wanted list and is a member of the Villainous league. But the problem was that when it came to Captain Phasmic...

LILY

We shouldn't speak ill of the dead, but...

WOMAN

He was the worst.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

This just one of the many citizens in Peoria who had a negative interaction with the Captain.

On the street:

WOMAN

I was walking home one night after double shift when a man tried to assault me. I screamed for help, and whoosh, the Captain drops outta the sky and knocks the man out.

(then)

I was in shock and asked him: "Why would this happen to me?" And you know what he said?

(impression)

(MORE)

WOMAN (CONT'D)

"Maybe if you didn't dress that way." Then whoosh, just takes off again. Wait can I swear on this?

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Yeah, we'll just bleep it out.

WOMAN

Maybe if you didn't dress that way, you tight-wearing mother**** you wouldn't be such a ****ing ***face.

On the street:

MAN

He refused to fly me to safety because I was too fat. He flew down to tell me that.

(then)

My house was on fire!

On the street:

TEEN

Captain Phasmic? *Long string of bleeped obsenities* That guy!

Music.

T₁TT₁Y

It wasn't much of a shock that the city didn't eulogize him.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

It was however a shock, to Captain Phasmic.

CAPTAIN PHASMIC

I can't say that I was thrilled.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

He had pulled the oldest trick in the book. He had faked his own death.

CAPTAIN PHASMIC

Braino had this doomsday device, ready to light the air on fire or something, who really listens to the monologue.

(then)

Anyway, I rip this thing out of the ground and bring it into orbit.

(MORE)

CAPTAIN PHASMIC (CONT'D)

There's only a few seconds left so I think I'm gonna die. But when I throw it away it takes like twenty seconds to go off. Stupid Braino can't even make a timer. More like. Not a lot of Braino.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

Instead of flying back down to check on the public he made a decision.

CAPTAIN PHASMIC

I hadn't had a vacation in years and, everyone thinks I'm dead, so why not let them believe it? Just for a bit.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

So he flew home, packed away the costume and waited for a parade that would never come.

CAPTAIN PHASMIC

I went to my own funeral, you know to watch from a distance with a black umbrella, looking super good in case anyone hot recognized me.

(then)

But no one came. Two landscapers just dropped a tombstone and left. And that was it. Then some punk kid came past. And look. Look at this. Gum. On my tombstone.

(then)

F***ing gum. After I saved that kid's life. *Probably*.

(then)

Not even the Legion showed up. (then)

What am I paying those dues for if they aren't going at least give me a proper send off?

IRON BARRACUDA

It is company policy to notify the Legion if you are going to fake your own death.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

This is Iron Barracuda, Leader of the Heroic Legion.

IRON BARRACUDA

Sometimes it can be necessary for public safety and for the safety of the hero's family for such a deception.

(then)

So when the Legion accessed the situation, we believed it would be in the interest of both parties if we didn't play into the Captain's...

(ahem)

Plans.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

When he didn't get the swan song from the public or his co-workers. (then)

He took things into his own hands....

News recording.

NEWS REPORTER, RETURN TO SENDER, E2 We're here at the Peoria Spelling Bee Grand Championships where deceased superhero Captain Phasmic

has returned from the grave and he appears to be drunk.

CAPTAIN PHASMIC

C-c-can you spell ungrateful? I can. U, N, G, A, R, T. Full.

AUDIENCE MEMBER, RETURN TO SENDER, E2

Get off the stage!

CAPTAIN PHASMIC

You get off the stage!

Aside.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

The outburst cost him his position in the Legion, and he was banned from Licensed Hero work.

(adding)

For six months.

Interview.

CAPTAIN PHASMIC

You know how they say that if you look around the room and you can't find the asshole, the asshole is you?

(then)

Well what I learned is that I was surrounded by assholes.

ELLEN SPIEGEL

The Captain now spends his time flying around the city flipping off the people he once swore to protect.

(then)

They are happy to return the favor.

ETHAN

That was Ellen Spiegel, regular contributor to the show.

(then)

That's it for our program. Which we're recording from our studio and not in front of an audience after what happened the last time:

AUDIENCE MEMBER, RETURN TO SENDER, E2 Get off the stage!

ETHAN

PHIL AXION

(long island accent)

I've worked a lot of cases like the Big C's over the years. The United States has drawn people from across the universe, even people from other universes have immigrated to our great country and none of them, none of them, have the resume that my client has. How many people do you know that have saved the world more times than you can count on your fingers?

STEPHEN SINGH
